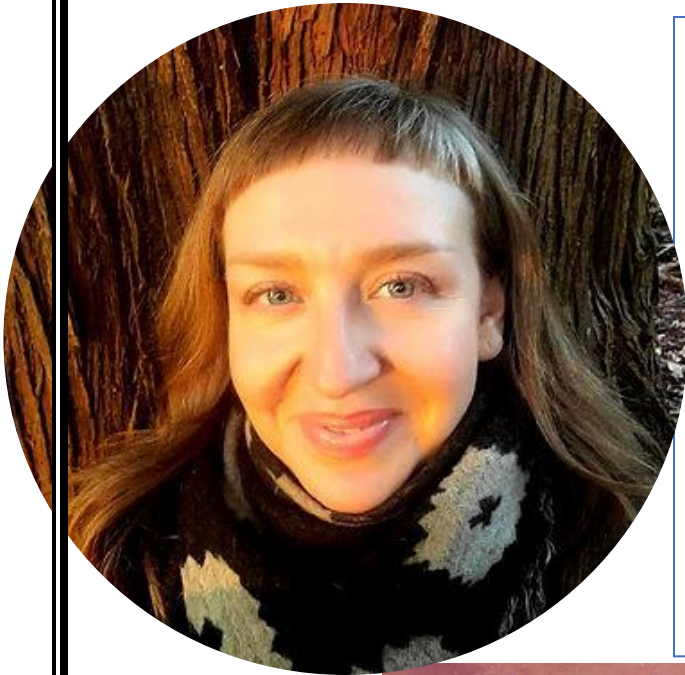

THE TRAUMA OF COLONIZATION, CONTINUED

For North Americans, colonization is the water we are swimming in- it underlies every element of modern life yet is largely unrecognized by the non-indigenous. Anna Soole is a Métis person of mixed Indigenous and settler heritage who has facilitated workshops on liberation and intersectional social justice issues internationally. They are a feminist, communicator, community organizer, assertiveness and empowerment coach, and theatre of the oppressed/forum theatre practitioner.

"It was only when I started my own decolonial and Indigenizing processes, reclaiming our Indigenous ways, learning my Indigenous histories and cultures, reconnecting to the land, and healing from intergenerational trauma that I found a sense of peace and wholeness within myself. For nearly two decades, I have been invited to facilitate deep, decolonial and anti-oppressive processes. My elders have taught me that when I am invited to share knowledge, it is my responsibility to provide it."

I currently reside on the unceded, illegally occupied ancestral homelands of the ɪ̓m̓əθkʷəy̓əm (Musqueam), Sḵ̓w̓w̓m̓esh (Squamish), Stó:lō, and Tsleil-Waututh Nations, colonially known as Vancouver, BC, Canada. I recognize the rightful sovereignty and land rights of these, and all Indigenous Nations across Turtle Island and around the globe.
